Helping the Communities Devastated by the Camp Fire

We continue to learn about further devastation and lives lost in the deadliest and most destructive wildfire in California history. As the Camp Fire continues to burn, and the communities devastated by that fire look forward, our hearts, thoughts and prayers go out to those who have lost so much to this fire. The City Council and staff have committed to raising funds to provide assistance to those communities. We would also like to acknowledge the members of our Community who have already and continue to make contributions of time, money and resources to those in need of so much.

There are a number of organizations that provide necessary and critical services in times of Disaster. A few are listed below.

- The [Red Cross](#) provides shelter and emotional support to evacuees.
- The [Salvation Army](#) provides meals to those affected by the wildfires.
- [Action News Now](#), a local TV station, has also created a list of local organizations that are providing support to victims of the Camp Fire.

For those impacted by the fire or seeking information on missing loved ones, [Butte County's](#) website is a comprehensive resource. It also includes opportunities to volunteer or make monetary donations.

The City has committed to raising funds for the [North Valley Animal Disaster Group](#), which takes care of animals left behind in the fires. This group and its volunteers work behind the fire lines evacuating, feeding and watering animals. They are working with veterinarians to provide emergency animal care. Animals are transported to emergency shelters, where the hope is that they can be reunited with their families. Please support us in our ongoing efforts to raise funds in the upcoming weeks. As events are organized, we will continue to post information.
